# About KIMSAN

Founded in July 2016 by Cephas A. Ssenyonjo, KIMSAN was established to extend the gospel beyond denominational. cultural. geographical boundaries. The vision was born while Cephas was serving as a missionary in the Anglican Church of Kenya, Butere Diocese, where he witnessed the pressing need for a mission organization that transcended denominational and cultural divisions. Initially starting with small evangelistic meetings and discipleship programs in Western Kenya, the ministry quickly gained momentum due to the dedication of its founding members and the pressing spiritual needs of the communities.

By 2017, KIMSAN had expanded its activities beyond Butere to regions including Nyanza, Central Kenya, and the Rift Valley, focusing on evangelism, church planting, and leadership development. The organization's emphasis on holistic ministry soon led to cross-border outreach efforts. In Uganda, KIMSAN partnered with local churches to strengthen discipleship programs, while in the Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC), the ministry focused on pastoral training and addressing community needs amidst challenging cultural dynamics. Over the years, KIMSAN's reach has extended across East Africa, with its impact rooted in both spiritual transformation and reflecting its socioeconomic empowerment, commitment to building secure, peaceful, and orderly communities through the Gospel of the Kingdom.

The heartbeat of KIMSAN is captured in the narrative of Reverend Cephas A. Ssenyonjo, whose missionary call birthed this organization.

His vision emerged during service as a Ugandan missionary in the Anglican Church of Kenya, under the leadership of the Rt. Rev. Dr. Timothy L. Wambunya. Inspired to start a missionary organization that transcends denominational, cultural, and geographical boundaries, Reverend Cephas founded KIMSAN to serve the entire body of Christ.

Since its inception, KIMSAN has evolved into a multifaceted organization with a profound impact. Leadership development, Christian ministry studies, Missions and church partnership, socioeconomic responses, and transformative events like the Royal Shepherds Couples' Retreat. These are expressions of KIMSAN's commitment to holistic ministry. The organization's vision is not confined to the walls of a local church but extends to the streets, homes, and hearts of individuals seeking the redemptive power of the Gospel.

In essence, KIMSAN is not merely an organization; it is a living testimony of faith in action. The journey from a single parish to serving millions is marked by resilience, compassion, and an unwavering dedication to the transformative love of God. 

The radiant smile on her face as she took her first ride in over a decade was a powerful testament to how simple acts of kindness can restore dignity, mobility, and transform lives. Moments like these reminded us of the profound impact we can make when we step forward in faith and love.

The year 2024 also marked a transformative chapter for KIMSAN as we elevated our calling to spread the gospel to new heights. We ventured into regions where cultural barriers and societal resistance had long hindered outreach efforts. Yet, guided by the unwavering truth that God's love knows no boundaries, we chose to look beyond cultural limitations and deeply rooted traditions. Instead, we focused on the universal message of hope, redemption, and salvation found in the good news of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Our 2024 mission, led us to the heart of Kehancha, a marginalized region in Migori known for its complex social dynamics. Here, we were reminded of the profound truth: "For God did not send His Son into the world to condemn the world, but to save the world through Him" (John 3:17). Inspired by this divine mission, we boldly followed in the footsteps of Jesus, reaching out to those often overlooked or cast aside by society. Kehancha became more than a location for ministry—it became a living testament to the power of faith, perseverance, and unconditional love.

Serving in this region was not without its challenges, but these obstacles became opportunities for growth and learning. They opened our eyes to the importance of cultural sensitivity in ministry. We realized that spreading the gospel is not a one-size-fits-all endeavor. It requires understanding the unique needs, fears, and aspirations of each community and tailoring our outreach to resonate with their lived experiences. This approach not only deepened our impact but also strengthened our connection with those we served.

As we reflect on 2024, our hearts overflow with gratitude for the lessons learned and the lives transformed. This year has deepened our commitment to spreading the gospel and reshaped our understanding of what it truly means to serve. Ministry is not just about sharing a message—it's about embodying it, living it, and allowing it to transform both the served and the servant. # Missions and Church **Partnership**

Missions and Church Partnership stand as the heartbeat of KIMSAN, where the fervor to spread the Gospel is ignited, and communities are transformed through collaboration and shared vision.

This strategic department serves as a catalyst, mobilizing local churches to embrace a holistic perspective on evangelism, discipleship, and community development.

The Evangelism and Discipleship Summits, transcends conventional boundaries, aiming to instill both a local and global outlook of the Lord's Great Command (Matthew 10:1, 28:18-20, and Acts 1:8). Through these summits, local churches are empowered to pray for and care for souls in their communities, fostering a sense of responsibility for both local and global spiritual and community well-being.

## The Migori Mission

KIMSAN's largest undertaking last year was the comprehensive Migori Mission 2024, extensive, multifaceted initiative targeting both the spiritual and physical needs of the people in Migori County. This mission spanned several months of planning, community engagement, and implementation, involving collaboration with over 50 local churches across six sub-counties (Uriri, Awendo, Suna East, Suna West, Kuria East, and Kuria West).

The Evangelism and Discipleship Summit, which saw the active participation of 300 Church leaders, played a pivotal role in mobilizing local Churches and communities. The summit aimed to instill a community and global outlook for evangelism, as instructed in Matthew 10:1 and Acts 1:8.

Through strategic planning and empowering messages, more than 100 local Churches were fully mobilized for mission, equipped for evangelism and discipleship, and inspired to lead positive change within their communities.

The "Be My Witness" Gospel Convention, with a reach of 5000 people in Molo and its environs, brought hope to the hopeless and joy to the depressed, aligning with the teachings in Luke 10:9. Beyond numerical impact, the mission became a vehicle for restoring relationships between individuals and God, fostering reconciliation among family members, and contributing to the overall well-being of the community.

Numbers are growing bigger in Church since the mission took place.



KIMSAN's largest undertaking last year was the comprehensive Migori Mission 2024. extensive, multifaceted initiative targeting both the spiritual and physical needs of the people in Migori County. This mission spanned several months of planning, community engagement, and implementation, involving collaboration with over 50 local churches across six sub-counties (Uriri, Awendo, Suna East, Suna West, Kuria East, and Kuria West). The mission combined evangelism, discipleship, medical outreach, and leadership development activities. Preparation included three outreach training sessions that equipped 250 missioners with essential evangelism skills, resulting in significant pre-mission community awareness.

During the mission, over 200 homes were reached through door-to-door evangelism, market outreaches, and open-air meetings, culminating in a total audience of more than 30,000 people. Notably, the mission included three medical camps providing critical healthcare services to 1,000 individuals and a two-day evangelism & discipleship summit attended by 350 church leaders. The spiritual impact was profound, with over 1,200 people accepting Christ and numerous testimonies of restored families and reconciled communities. This mission also unprecedented denominational unity, with pastors from diverse backgrounds working together harmoniously to fulfill the Great Commission.

# **Evangelism & Discipleship Summit (December 18-19)**

We engaged 350 church leaders from six subcounties: Uriri, Awendo, Suna East, Suna West, Kuria East, and Kuria West. Participants included lead pastors, youth leaders, evangelists, and women's ministry coordinators, ensuring holistic leadership representation.

The summit theme, Loving Christ, Feeding His Sheep (John 21:15–17), focused on deepening pastoral care, enhancing evangelism strategies, and encouraging spiritual renewal among leaders who often face ministry fatigue. Workshops covered practical topics such as conflict resolution within congregations, strategies for effective discipleship, and methods for reaching unchurched populations.

Each day began with corporate prayer and worship, fostering a spirit of unity. Facilitators included regional church leaders and KIMSAN's leadership team, who provided both theological insights and practical ministry applications.

Small group discussions allowed leaders to share local challenges and develop contextual ministry solutions. Testimonies from participants highlighted a revival in local church leadership, with many leaders expressing renewed zeal for community evangelism. One attendee noted, "This summit has reignited my passion for ministry. I now feel equipped to shepherd my congregation more effectively."

A closing commissioning service saw leaders prayed over and sent back to their communities with actionable ministry plans. Participants committed to establishing monthly accountability groups to sustain momentum post-summit, ensuring long-term impact beyond the event.

### **Uriri Outreach**

The three-day outreach in Uriri resulted in significant spiritual breakthroughs and extensive community engagement. Preparation for the mission involved weeks of prayer meetings, local church mobilization, and outreach training sessions with over 100 missioners drawn from surrounding areas. Mission activities included:

- House-to-house Evangelism: A dedicated team reached 200 homes, sharing the gospel, praying with families, addressing community concerns, and distributing Bibles. Many residents opened up about personal struggles, prompting follow-up visits and pastoral care connections with local churches.
- Public Evangelism and Open-Air Meetings: Over 2,000 individuals heard the Gospel through organized marketplace preaching, street evangelism, and three evening open-air crusades worship sessions, lifetransforming featuring testimonies, and clear presentations. Gospel Children's evangelism activities also concurrently, engaging more than 200 young people through Bible stories, songs, and games.
- Salvations and Discipleship: More than 150 people committed their lives to Christ.



New believers were immediately connected with local churches for follow-up, with 60% attending an introductory discipleship class during the outreach. Plans were made to establish small groups to nurture spiritual growth among these converts.

- Denominational Unity and Cooperation: The mission fostered unprecedented collaboration among 50 denominational leaders representing Anglican, Pentecostal, Baptist, and independent churches. Joint planning meetings, prayer breakfasts, and pastoral forums during the outreach strengthened unity and set a foundation for future cooperative ministry. One pastor expressed gratitude, remarking, "I've never seen such unity among churches in my 15 years here. KIMSAN has shown us the beauty of serving as one body of Christ."
- Community Service Initiatives: Volunteers participated in cleaning public areas such as marketplaces and bus stops, demonstrating love through action. These acts of service opened further evangelistic opportunities, leading to fruitful conversations and prayer sessions with bystanders.
- Impact Stories: Notably, a local shop owner who had distanced himself from church for over a decade publicly testified to accepting Christ after a street evangelism encounter. Additionally, a family experiencing severe domestic issues invited missioners into their home, resulting in both parents and two children surrendering their lives to Jesus. The outreach concluded with a community Thanksgiving service attended by over 800 people, where new believers were introduced to local pastors and provided with followup materials. Plans were established to host quarterly revival meetings to sustain the momentum built during this mission.

# Migori mission Photo Highlights



### **DRC Mission (Lubumbashi)**

Responding to an invitation from local church leaders, KIMSAN embarked on a transformative mission to Lubumbashi, the second-largest city in the Democratic Republic of Congo. This mission aimed to provide theological training, establish strategic partnerships, and explore opportunities for a more sustained presence in the region.

#### Pastoral Training and Leadership Development:

- Rev. Cephas conducted an intensive pastoral training session for 40 pastors, focusing on Renewal and God's Greatness (Isaiah 40:27- 31). The training equipped pastors with practical tools for discipleship, church leadership, and spiritual growth in a region where biblical teaching is often diluted by traditional and animistic influences.
- Topics included scriptural interpretation, church administration, community engagement, and personal spiritual discipline. Many pastors expressed gratitude, highlighting the lack of structured theological training in the region and their eagerness for continuous engagement with KIMSAN.

#### Strategic Discussions for Long-term Outreach:

- Engaged in meetings with local Christian leaders to discuss registering KIMSAN in the DRC as a formally recognized ministry, which would allow for more structured evangelistic and discipleship programs.
- Explored partnerships with local churches and institutions to establish a permanent theological training center in Lubumbashi to address the shortage of well-equipped Christian leaders.

#### Spiritual and Cultural Insights:

 Lubumbashi, though mineral-rich, is marked by widespread poverty and a socio-economic system dominated by foreign entities. Many people struggle with economic hardships and lack spiritual guidance.

- The region is predominantly influenced by Catholicism and animistic traditions, leading to a syncretic approach to Christianity that often blends biblical teachings with indigenous spiritual practices.
- Witnessed a significant hunger for the gospel, as many believers expressed a deep desire for sound doctrine and authentic biblical teaching.

#### **Future Prospects:**

- Plans are underway to develop leadership exchange programs, bringing pastors from the DRC to Kenya for theological training at KIMSOM.
- Establishing a resource distribution network to provide Bibles and Christian literature in both French and local dialects, addressing the scarcity of accessible biblical materials.
- A long-term mission strategy is being crafted to expand outreach beyond Lubumbashi into other parts of the DRC, working alongside regional church networks.

This mission to Lubumbashi was a crucial step in laying the foundation for KIMSAN's expansion into Central Africa. The enthusiasm and commitment of local church leaders underscored the necessity of continued investment in this mission field.

The groundwork has been set for future engagements, with a vision to empower church leaders, equip believers, and spread the gospel throughout the region.

#### Responding to an invitation from local church leaders:

- Cephas conducted pastoral training for 40 pastors, emphasizing renewal and God's greatness (Isaiah 40:27-31).
   Engaged in discussions to register KIMSAN in the DRC for sustained outreach.

Founded as a response to the dire need for formal biblical and Christian ministry education , KIMSOM plays a pivotal role in fulfilling KIMSAN's broader intention of glorifying God by knowing Him alone and making Him known among all the nations of the earth through the Gospel of the Kingdom. The institution offers certificate and diploma courses that delve into biblical leadership skills, theological knowledge, and practical ministry applications.

## **Curriculum and Impact**

KIMSOM's vision is to transform lay people into transformational leaders within and outside the local church building. Our vision gives both local and global outlook of Community transformation through the Gospel of the Kingdom.

The Socio-Economic Response department embodies KIMSAN's commitment to manifesting the practical love of God, addressing the multifaceted needs of communities with compassion and resilience.

This comprehensive approach encompasses four pivotal programs—Relief Response, Simeon's House, Rising Star, and The Flourish—each designed to create a tangible impact across diverse age groups and socioeconomic backgrounds.

Relief Response & Simeon's House: The Relief Response & Simeon's House initiative has been instrumental in restoring dignity and offering hope to the most vulnerable populations in Kisumu and Nakuru. The program provides essential support for those affected by natural disasters, economic hardship, and social isolation. Key accomplishments in 2024 include:

 Emergency relief distributions supplying over 50 homes with food, clothing, clean water, and shelter assistance in Kisumu and Nakuru

- . The emergency relief distribution helps the elderly from being exploited by bad people due to lack of basic items. Orphans, widows, people with disability and the elderly are among the beneficiaries of this program.
  - Elderly care initiatives through Simeon's House, where isolated seniors receive medical care, psychosocial support, and spiritual guidance to foster emotional and mental well-being.
  - Counseling and discipleship sessions tailored to address grief, depression, and abandonment issues among the elderly and other vulnerable groups.
  - Medical outreach and wellness clinics providing preventive health services and chronic disease management for seniors who lack access to proper medical care. Through these initiatives, KIMSAN continues to embody Christ's call to serve "the least of these" by providing holistic care that nurtures both physical and spiritual well-being. As we move into 2025, efforts will be directed toward expanding the reach of these programs, increasing resource mobilization, and strengthening long-term sustainability strategies.

## **Migori Medical Camp**

The Migori mission Medical Camps organized by KIMSAN were a significant initiative aimed at addressing the healthcare needs of the local community. Held on November and December 2024, the outreach event exemplified our commitment to holistic community development and the practical demonstration of God's love.

The primary objective of the medical camps were to provide accessible healthcare services to individuals who may face barriers in obtaining medical assistance.

It brought together a dedicated team of healthcare professionals, volunteers, and support staff from the county government and private hospitals to deliver a range of medical services, including cancer screening, treatment of common ailments like cold & cough, malaria, Infections, kids immunization, nutrition services, HIV Testing and Counselling, screening for diabetes and the distribution of essential medications.

One of the notable aspects of the Migori Medical Camps was its focus on preventive healthcare and health education.

Attendees received valuable information on topics such as hygiene practices, disease prevention, and maintaining a healthy lifestyle. The camp also facilitated discussions on the importance of regular medical check-ups and early detection of potential health issues.

Through strategic partnerships with Life Care hospital, and the ministry of health, we were able to enhance the impact of the medical camp. Collaborating with professionals from diverse medical fields allowed us to offer a comprehensive range of services, addressing various health concerns within the community. The success of the Migori Medical Camps was not just measured by the number of individuals who received immediate medical attention but also by the lasting impact on the overall health awareness of the community.

The Migori Medical Camp underscored the essence of KIMSAN's commitment to serving the whole person—physically, emotionally, and spiritually. By addressing immediate medical needs and empowering individuals with knowledge, we aim to create a positive and sustainable impact on the well-being of the communities we serve.

While we may have had shortage of medical supplies, our team of medical practitioners successfully managed to see 600 patients and served them efficiently giving referrals where necessary.

Another most inspiring highlight of our initiative was the incredible success of the blood donation drive, which ran alongside the medical camp. Together, we donated an astounding 100 pints of blood, a vital contribution that will help alleviate the critical blood shortage in Migori County. This act of generosity not only saved lives but also strengthened the bond within the community.

Equally moving was the spiritual impact of our outreach. Our dedicated team of evangelists brought hope and transformation to countless individuals through heartfelt one-on-one evangelism, leading many souls to embrace faith and find solace in the Lord even in their illness. These moments of spiritual awakening were as profound as the medical care we provided, reminding us of the holistic healing we strive to achieve.

Despite the challenges we encountered, our resolve and faith remains unshaken. We are committed to continuous growth, learning from every outreach to refine our approach and amplify our impact. By carefully analyzing what drives participation and engagement, we are crafting even more effective strategies for future medical camps. Our mission is clear: to create lasting change and uplift the communities we serve, one life at a time. Together, we are building a brighter, healthier, and more hopeful future.


As Flourish continues to impact lives, it stands as a testament to KIMSAN's commitment to nurturing the potential of the next generation and creating a lasting legacy of positive change.

# Financial Overview January-December 2024



KIMSAN acknowledges several challenges that have impacted our fiscal standing. The rising cost of living, coupled with inflation, has exerted substantial pressure on our financial resources. Since the beginning of the year(2024), we have witnessed a sustained increase in the prices of essential commodities, with basic living expenses such as food and housing experiencing a significant surge.

One of the primary challenges this of this past financial year was a budget shortfall. While our generous donors demonstrated unwavering support, our initial income projection of \$136,216 proved overly optimistic given current funding realities. This gap will prompt a thorough review of our budgeting processes, and we will implement more conservative forecasting models—alongside diversified revenue streams—to ensure greater alignment between goals and resources moving forward. Over the past seven months, we have been grateful for God's grace, as we managed to raise slightly more than 80% of our projected budget.

This shortfall necessitated a restructuring of our operations, leading to the elimination of certain ministry tasks and the postponement of others. Ministry tasks, such as the Kingdom Leadership and Theological Convention (2024) and the Royal Shepherds couples' retreat did not takeplace due to financial constraints. This strategic adjustment aimed to ensure that, despite financial challenges, we could still uphold our commitment to the critical missions and projects outlined in the KIMSAN 2021-2024 strategic plan.

The financial overview underscores KIMSAN's adaptability and commitment to responsible financial management.

As we tread through a changing economic landscape, the organization remains focused on sustaining its core activities and achieving the goals outlined in the KIMSAN Vision 2042. The acknowledgment of God's providence and the commitment to balance administration costs with impactful ministry tasks exemplify KIMSAN's unwavering faith in its mission despite financial complexities.




#### THE KIMSAN INCOME IN THE YEAR 2024

Each initiative is designed to advance the Kingdom, empower communities, and bring hope to those in need. Your partnership is vital in making these transformative projects a reality. - Missions and Church Partnerships (Acts 1:8); We are committed to spreading the Gospel and equipping believers to be effective witnesses. This year, we will host an Evangelism and Discipleship Summit and the Be My Witness Gospel Convention in Vihiga County, Conduct a Gospel Outreach and Mini Crusade in San Mariko, Nakuru County, organize a Medical Camp and Gospel Outreach in Nyatike, Migori County, provide Discipleship and Evangelism Training in Migori and Nakuru Counties and continue the Christ in the Marketplace program in Molo, reaching professionals and business owners. These efforts will bring hope, healing, and spiritual growth to thousands. The total Budget is \$45,000.
- Leadership training and Christian Ministry studies (2 Tim 2:1-2); Strong leadership is the backbone of thriving communities. This year, we will host KIMSOM classes in Kisumu and Nakuru, culminating in a graduation ceremony and Convene the Kingdom Leadership and Theological Convention in Lubumbashi, DRC, to equip leaders across borders. By investing in leaders, we are building a foundation for sustainable ministry and community transformation. The total budget is \$28,800
- Socio-Economic Response (James 1:27, 2:14-17); We believe in addressing both spiritual and physical needs. Our socio-economic initiatives include: Relief Response Programs in Nyakach, Nakuru, and Kisumu. Supporting The Simeon's House and The Rising Star (school fees program). Hosting Flourish Initiatives and Free Medical Camps in Vihiga, Nyakach, Nyatike, and San Mariko. These programs will provide critical support to vulnerable families, ensuring they have access to education, healthcare, and basic necessities. The total Budget is \$23,680
- Administration, and Cephas and Janice's family support; A total of \$39,480 is allocated to support essential administrative operations, including office expenses such as office rent, vehicle maintenance, insurance, statutory deductions, utilities, internet, security, office supplies, salaries, wages, and bank-related fees at \$25,080. Additionally, these funds provided crucial support for Cephas and Janice's household needs at \$14,400. This investment ensures the continuity of our operations while fostering a stable and productive environment for our team leaders and their family.
- Infrastructural development and Media (INFDM); To sustain and expand our impact, we are investing in long-term infrastructure and media capabilities: Land Purchase, Surveying, Beaconing, and Fencing for KIMSOM, acquiring Videography and Photography Equipment to document and share our work effectively. These investments will ensure our ministry has a solid foundation and the tools needed to amplify our message. The total Budget is \$20,400 (12%)
- **Contingency fund:** To safeguard our programs, we have set aside a Contingency Fund of \$12,000. This will serve as a safety net for unforeseen expenses, ensuring that our work continues uninterrupted.
